#### Construction update

- Repair of steel frame under windows has slowed down construction. No internal work could be done until that was completed.
- TDSB had to approve new work if problems were found which also delayed construction.
- Fire panel is buzzing if it goes on they have to have the school monitored for 24hrs. Runnymede Adventure Club (RAC) are not in right rooms because of this – still a work in progress.
- Construction hasn't been reliable. Major work was completed but small things have been missed. Admin is trying to work on them. Most work should be completed by end of the month.
- Full Day Kindergarten yard (Colbeck St.) work has not started. Likely won't

begin until October. Amelia has asked them to give us priority.

Information has not been given out because it is constantly changing.

#### Full Day Kindergarten Update

- Enrollment is down from projected.
- There are no class size caps on JK or English SK.
- The class size cap on French SK is 26.
- Some programs have had to move to accommodate FDK.

#### Other Updates

- We are no longer getting Keele students for Grade 7 & 8 and next year we will not have Howard students.
- Two or Three parent volunteers are needed for the Safe & Caring Schools Committee. Please email Amelia directly if you are interested. Committee members need to be available during business hours (8am – 5pm).
- Lice squad. Public health will come in Sept 25<sup>th</sup> JK Gr.5 Need volunteers email Amelia. Jackie suggested getting a professional service to come in (e.g. Nit Wits). Administration prefers to try the public health first.
- Astro turf update. This was put out to tender and the lowest came in at \$150,000 over budget. It is being put to tender again this fall. This will not move forward until the Colbeck yard for Kindergarten is finished (October).

#### **Yard Committee - Sarah Frame**

- 1. Held 2 Yard Day events in Spring and Fall, with Fall BBQ and Spring Earth Day Activities support by Spirit Committee
- 2. Maintain Hillside Garden and Manage Pathway Erosion
  - a. Invasive species removal
  - b. Building pathways/stairs to connect upper and lower trails
  - c. Mulching of trails
- 3. Maintain other specialty gardens
  - a. Front beds, mums
  - b. Kinder-Garden
  - c. Class Food Garden
- 4. Manage Green Teacher program for all Grade 2, 4 and 6 classes
  - a. Also 9 kindergarten classes in Spring

- Obtained \$2,000 TD FEF Grant that allowed us to conduct native species planting program with Grade 6 classes, while also giving \$1,000 back to Council Budget
- 5. Look for ways to Enhance Schoolyard Functionality at Recess Time
  - a. Recess balls and hula hoops inventory, maintenance and re-stock in Fall and Spring
  - b. Participated in planning/meetings for turf field and FDK Yard, and advocate on behalf of parents
  - c. Planning of front yard refresh hopefully in advance of Centennial
- 6. Support Runnymede's Eco-Schools certification and audit as well as Green Team initiatives
- 7. 2 Key Yard Committee Members/Founders teachers Anne Lakoff and Karen McGill retired in June, but I am pleased to report that Shelley Boulton, Taye Maddison and Jason deJager have joined the Yard Committee, along with Anne Markee. Great teacher representation.

## **STEM Committee – Jerry Tiessen**

- The Junior teams won the Inspirational Award for the team which reflects FLL values the most.

- Best Buy Grant
